

Instructions to Obtain Acceptable Verification of Tax Information

As part of federal student aid eligibility, the student and parents will be required to consent and approve sharing and importing income and tax information from the IRS to the FAFSA form, even if the attempt to obtain or use such data is ineffective.

If the parents filed separate 2023 IRS income tax returns, both must provide consent and approval to share and import income and tax information from the IRS on the FAFSA. In most cases, no further documentation is needed to verify 2023 income information that was transferred into the student's FAFSA using income and tax information directly from the IRS.

If 2023 income tax return information for the student and/or parent(s) was not available or could not be used, the student and/or parent should provide the institution with a 2023 IRS Tax Return Transcript(s) or a signed copy of the 2023 income tax return and applicable schedules (see additional instructions below).

Tax Return Filers choose ONE of the following:

• IRS Tax Return Transcript:

IRS Federal 1040 Tax Return (signed):

You may provide a **signed** copy of your 2023 Federal 1040 Tax Return form and all submitted tax schedules (1-6). If completed by a tax preparer or tax professional, the Federal 1040 Tax Return form must include name and address of the preparer on the return, as well as the tax preparer's Social Security Number (SSN), Employer Identification Number (EIN), or Preparer Tax Identification Number (PTIN). Please add student's name and/or ID number before submitting.**

Important Notes:

- An individual who filed an amended IRS income tax return for tax year 2023 must provide:
 - A signed copy of the 2023 IRS Form 1040X, "Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return," that was filed with the IRS <u>as well as</u> either
 - Updated income and tax information from the IRS on the FAFSA with all tax information from the original tax return OR
 - A 2023 IRS Tax Return Transcript (that will only include information from the original tax return and does not have to be signed), or any other IRS tax transcript(s) that includes all of the income and tax information required to be verified, OR
 - Signed copy of the 2023 1040 tax return and the applicable schedules that were filed with the IRS.
- If your parents are married, and filed separate 2023 tax returns, 2023 IRS tax return transcripts or signed copies of the Federal 1040 Tax Return for 2023 must be submitted for each parent.
