Students must register their vehicles annually.

Every vehicle parked on campus must display a current year permit, no matter where you park or your length of stay.

Avoiding parking lickels: The most common violation issued is for parking in a space/lot without the proper permit. You can easily avoid violations by:

- Register your vehicle for a parking permit, put the permit on your vehicle, and park where your permit allows.
- Read the SNC Parking Bulletin emails. Your campus email is the primary communication for parking notifications.
- Make sure your vehicle is parked within the lines that
 define the parking space and your wheels remain on the
 paved surface. (Do not drive or park on the grass, park
 over a sidewalk, in front of an apron, etc.)

Permits must be affixed to the inside, driver side bottom corner of the rear windshield.

<u>Loading / Unloading</u>: Temporary (15 minute) parking is available in the Reid St. loading zones or the Marsh St. cul-de-sac. **You must have your emergency lights flashing.** (Vehicles on Reid St. must be parked parallel to the curb).

<u>Communication</u>: Parking Bulletins (info on lot closures, snow plowing, etc.) will be made via SNC News and/or emails sent directly to your SNC email account. *Students are responsible for monitoring their SNC email for all parking messages*.

* OPEN LOT TIMES - A Great Time to Run Your Errands

During open lot times, Monday-Friday 3:30 p.m.-2:00 a.m. & Saturday-Sunday 6:00 a.m.-2:00 a.m., students can park in any employee/commuter signed lot. Do Not Park Overnight.

WEEKEND PARKING - Open or Closed? Check your email

Check your email each Friday for that Weekend's Parking Status, OPEN or CLOSED, and that weekend's parking exceptions. When OPEN, students are allowed to park in the employee/commuter signed lots overnight on Friday & Saturday night.

Need a Parking Exception: If you need an exception to any parking rule, you MUST contact Campus Safety (920-403-3299) **BEFORE** you park your vehicle.

What if my vehicle does not start? Campus Safety offers free jump start service 24/7/365. Call 920-403-3299

Walking - Free Exercise! Walking is the easiest way to access campus and the surrounding areas - no need to move your vehicle! Students are expected to walk to campus activities, classes, campus jobs, the cafeteria, the library, the Campus Center (mailroom), the Sports Center, etc.

No Parking Areas/Restricted Parking: Visitor lots, behind Main Hall, Campus Center area, loading dock areas, and signed parking spots (e.g. handicapped spots, preferred parking, etc. - without proper permit or placard). Parking in these areas will result in an SNC parking ticket and the vehicle may be towed.

Where can I park with my parking permit?

Orange/PX: assigned underground space in PX only *
Red/Preferred: assigned red preferred spots in P6 only *
Green/Resident: P6 (yellow spots), P12, P13, P16, P17,& P21
Green/House: primarily your house driveway (vehicles that do not fit in the driveway can park in any resident student lot)
Blue/Commuter: P4, P5, P8, P9, P15. These lots are no overnight parking regardless of permit type.* For overnight parking if needed, park in a resident student lot.

White/Weekly temporary: Valid for P21 Sixth St. lot only Student's Visitor/Guest: park in the P21 Sixth St. lot only.

Can I get a ride to different spots & lots on campus?

Yes, the **campus safely shuffle** can pick up and drop off students at any building or parking lot on campus. The shuttle runs 7 days a week from 5 p.m. to 1 a.m. when classes are in session during the fall and spring semesters. To request a free shuttle ride, call 920-422-RIDE (7433).

After 1 a.m. a free **safety escort** can be requested from a campus safety officer on duty, 920-403-3299.

What if there is no place to park? Check the P21 Sixth St. lot. There are over 800 legal resident student parking spaces on campus. Unfortunately, not all of them could be located close to campus buildings. There will always be a space available for you somewhere, but you are not guaranteed parking within your favorite lot. Overflow parking is available at the stadium.

Can I park on the street? The campus portion of Reid St. & Marsh St. (both east of Third St.) are SNC parking, require an SNC permit, and are no overnight parking areas from 2am-6am Monday-Friday and Saturday & Sunday when weekend parking is CLOSED. Parking overnight will result in a No Overnight Parking ticket from SNC.

Be aware, that all other street parking in De Pere is owned, regulated, and enforced by the City of De Pere. De Pere's ordinance restricts street parking "No Overnight Parking" from 2 a.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Friday. Make sure you review the signs posted on the street before parking.

What happens if I don't pay my parking ticket(s)?

Unpaid SNC parking fines may result in a hold being placed on your registration, grades, and/or transcripts. Tickets need to be paid at the Student Account Services office. Tickets may be appealed (within 10 class days) by submitting an appeal form online. Appeals will be responded to within 10 class days of receipt. <code>snc.edu/go/parkingticket</code>



^{*} The exception for no overnight parking is when weekend parking is OPEN. When OPEN, overnight parking is allowed in the employee/commuter lots, typically Friday and Saturday night. See your email each Friday for that weekend's status and details.
